



Take a Stand



PLASMA TECHNOLOGY IS GROOVY, but not everyone wants to break into a wall to accommodate a 60-inch screen and hide the cables.

Designer Louis A. Lara has masterminded a savvy solution with his powder-coated steel, adjustable-height plasma stand for BDI that can be incorporated with a pair of optional shelves.

One nifty feature: The cables and connections are concealed behind an easy-access back panel that can house even a surge protector strip inside. The unhandy can take heart knowing that the panel can be removed with a turn of one screw.

Buy a second stand, remove the top bracket and add the shelves, and you have an audio tower to match your plasma stand. Cool.
