


A potter's wheel turning, a man's hand manipulating the mass of clay to give an elegant and useful shape.



Albisola began to develop the manufacture of ceramics by the end of the fifteenth century.

Alluviums of red clay and quarries of white earth can be found in many parts of the territory.



During the passing centuries, the handicraftsmen of Albisola set the fashion and made the town an important center of artistic workshops, now known across the world. Her little streets are



dotted by shops keeping artistic treasures, like the traditional yellow terracotta and the white majolica.
