Regularly vacuum the rug on a low-power setting. Vacu

Do not pull the yarn out, as this may result in damage

uum the rug from different angles. If you see any loose threads on the face, they should be trimmed with scissor
to the rug. Canister vacuums without a beater bar are most effective in cleaning shag rugs.

: With a clean sponge and soap mix, remove the remainder of the stain. Allow the area to dry. For all-over cleanings. Do not pull the threads on the face to avoid unraveling or damage to the rug. Spills should be blotted with a clean towel.

With a clean sponge and soap mix, gently remove the remainder of the stain. Avoid using excessive water. Blot

ing, spray with a mixture of soap and water and rinse with a garden hose.
lean, undyed cloth to absorb as much of the spill as possible. Work from the outer edges of the spill towards the

area with a dry towel. Vacuum regularly. Avoid vacuums with invasive beater bars. We recommend using a profi

center. Gently blot the area.
